Habitat for Humanity of Jacksonville is here to help residents of Duval, Baker, and Nassau counties achieve the dream of homeownership. With the support of community partners and volunteers, we have empowered 2,400 families to own a home. Each quality home is built brand new and sold to partner families at no profit, financed with affordable loans you won't find with other builders or banks.

Who can qualify?*

1. Homebuyers must demonstrate a need for housing
2. Homebuyers must be able to demonstrate they can afford a monthly mortgage payment and a small down payment
3. Household income must fall within our program guidelines (see table on the other side of this flyer)
4. Homebuyers must have fair credit (a score of at least 620 with no recent bankruptcies, liens or judgments)
5. All household members must be U.S. Citizens or permanent legal residents.

Take the eligibility quiz



To be eligible for a home through Habitat, you must demonstrate:

- ✓ **A need for housing**
Living in unsafe or overcrowded conditions, Section 8 or public housing, spending more than 40% of income on housing, etc.
- ✓ **An ability to pay**
You must have good credit, savings, and a stable income that allows you to pay a mortgage monthly, as well as a small down payment.
- ✓ **A willingness to partner**
You will complete homebuyer education classes and also volunteer with Habitat, helping others build their homes.

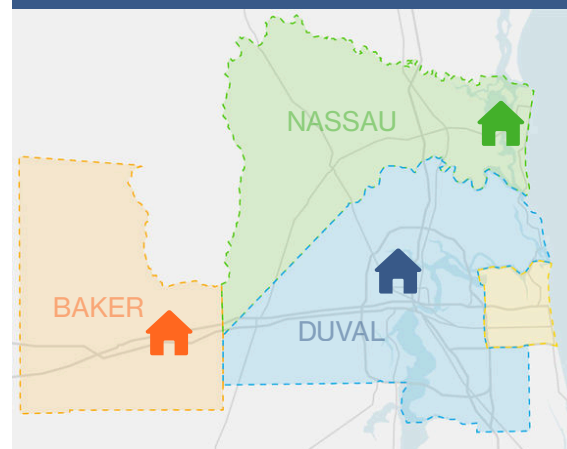

Household Size	Minimum Income	Maximum Income
One	\$38,000	\$86,160
Two	\$38,000	\$98,400
Three	\$38,000	\$110,760
Four	\$38,000	\$123,000
Five	\$42,000	\$132,840
Six	\$45,000	\$142,680
Seven	\$48,000	\$152,520
Eight	\$50,000	\$162,360

Household gross income includes the regular, established income of all applicants from all sources, before taxes or other deductions. Maximum income guidelines also apply, and income requirements in specific communities will vary. All guidelines outlined in this flyer are subject to change at any time.
